Season's greetings from your Algonquin Township! As 2022 winds down I wanted to highlight some of our accomplishments of 2022. The Crystal Lake Cemetery pillars got a much-needed facelift and we added a flag pole with light to commemorate the 54 veterans buried there. The **Chunn's Burial Ground** received much needed landscaping to shore up erosion that was starting to occur.



We are now accepting applications for **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program** (LIHEAP) and **Low Income Household Water Assistance Program** (LIHWAP). **AARP Smart Driver Courses** were offered in both October and November to accommodate the large number of responses.

Touch a Truck on August 20 was an amazing success with over 400 children in attendance. A great big "Shout Out" to the 15 organizations that brought trucks and 23 donors and sponsors that helped make this event a success!

On November 9, 2022, at the request of residents and the McHenry County Division of Environment Health, the Algonquin Township Board approved a resolution to place a binding referendum question on the April 4, 2023 General Primary ballot, that allows Algonquin Township to contract for a consolidated solid waste removal service for those who live on the unincorporated roads. Only those located on unincorporated roads will be able to vote on whether to implement a common waste hauler.

Almost 90% of the residents in Algonquin Township already have a common waste hauler based on the municipality in which they live. The other 10%, or over 3,700 households, live on unincorporated roads, have up to 4 choices of waste haulers to choose from, leaving as many as 12 trucks per week driving up and down the same roads.

As our county continues to grow, traffic congestion and road maintenance become more and more challenging and even more expensive to taxpayers.

There are *many benefits to voting "YES"* to having a common carrier for solid waste collection and it's a win-win for everyone

- Economies of scale for pricing many residents are paying up to 2.5 times more than their neighbors located within a municipality who have a common waste carrier. Implementation of a Senior discount program and options for smaller containers for seniors would also be included in the contract.
- Increased services and a larger variety of solid waste (garbage) removal services including recyclables, yard waste and large items. Additional services could include Christmas tree recycling, shred events, etc.
- Road maintenance costs and pot holes large trucks wear out roads at a far greater rate than passenger cars. Waste hauler trucks are driving over the same roads all week long with each carrier having 2-3 trucks on those roads to pick up garbage, recycling and other items that equates to 12 trucks that could be driving in your neighborhood each week. A decrease in truck traffic would also help control maintenance costs, lead to a decrease in potholes and ultimately save tax dollars.
- Decrease in traffic congestion and carbon emissions

A letter will be sent to each household that this decision impacts in January 2023. The letter will contain all the information you need to make an informed decision when you go to vote, including a Question & Answer section. There will also be contact information in case you have further questions or comments.


